- Pima Medial Institute
 - Qualified candidates may transfer credits towards a Healthcare Administration Associate Degree

COURSES AND CREDITS

Post-secondary opportunity available at Northwest and Southwest Campuses through a partnership with Pima Medical Institute (PMI)

- College course credits include:
 - CCM101 Communication (3 credits)
 - CCL 100 Computer Literacy (2 credits)
 - HCA 100 Office Management (4 credits)
 - HIT 155 Electronic Health Records (4 credits)
 - MTH 132 Basic College Mathematics (3 credits)

NOTE: Students may also apply Dual Enrollment credit and/or Advanced Placement (AP) qualifying test score toward the ENG 101 requirement, per the PMI admission policies.

- West-MEC Dental Assisting program graduates may be eligible to transfer credit for all courses, up to 19 total credits, in the Pima Medical Health Care Administration program as listed above.

COST REQUIREMENTS

- Any student who graduates from high school and completes all courses in the West-MEC Dental Assisting Program with a grade of B or higher can receive college credits (at no cost).
